# **Fire Situation Update**

# Total Area of Ovens Fire Complex - 105910ha approx.

The fire is contained and is generally quiet.

There has been scattered amounts of rain across Ovens district ranging from 1.6 millimetres to 26.8 millimetres in the last 24 hours.

Ground crews are focused on track clearing, hazardous tree treatment, patrolling and treating hotspots.

A rapid risk assessment team has been assigned to the fire and is presently assessing biodiversity values, debris flows and cultural heritage sites across the fireground.

#### **Community Meetings**

There are currently no community meetings planned at this time. Regular updates are being published on the DELWP Hume Facebook page to keep residents informed.

#### Weather

Forecast for Tuesday 11 February

Humid. Cloudy. High chance of showers, most likely in the afternoon and evening. The chance of a thunderstorm in the afternoon and evening. Light winds. Daytime temperatures reaching 23 to 30.

#### Forecast for Wednesday 12 February

Partly cloudy. Medium chance of showers, most likely in the afternoon and evening. The chance of a thunderstorm in the morning and afternoon. Light winds becoming south-easterly 15 to 20 km/h during the afternoon then becoming light during the evening. Daytime temperatures reaching 23 to 33. Starting from Monday 10th February (weather permitting), aerial shooting operations will take place on fire-affected public land in the Mount Buffalo National Park and Alpine National Park. These operations will only be carried out in areas which are closed to the public.

The community are reminded to stay out of areas closed to public until advised that the area is safe and open to public.

The aerial shooting operation is an immediate response action under the Victorian Government's biodiversity bushfire response program.

The aerial shooting operation will be targeting pest predators and large pest herbivores in priority fire-affected areas as a necessary and urgent action to give native plants and animals the best chance of survival after the fires.

During the aerial operation, people may see a helicopter and be able to hear gunshots.

The aerial shooting program will be carried out under strict conditions designed to ensure the operation is safe, effective and humane. Highly qualified pilots and shooters will be used during the operation.

#### SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE: Emergency Bushfire Response in Primary Industries \$75,000 Grants

This program helps pay for the costs of clean-up and other emergency measures including:

- repairing or replacing fencing and horticultural netting
- disposing of dead stock
- rebuilding or replacing damaged or destroyed on-farm infrastructure
- additional labour costs and more.

Claims can be made for activities/costs incurred since the date of the event.

# Transport subsidy:

This program covers 50 per cent of the total freight costs to a maximum of \$15,000 (excluding GST) per farm business. Applicants can apply for a combination of the following transport activities:

- transport of emergency fodder for stock to fire-affected properties
- transport of stock to agistment, including returning stock
- transport of stock to sale or slaughter
- transport of emergency stock drinking water.
  Claims can be made for activities/cost incurred since the date of the event. A maximum distance of 1,500 km applies per movement of stock and fodder and 500 km per movement of water. A minimum load of 20 dry sheep equivalents applies for movements of stock (loads of less than this will be assessed on a case by case basis). The minimum load for water and fodder is 500 kg.

# Flying drones near emergencies

Emergency situations can be dangerous for people, property and the environment. Flying your drone near emergencies can cause major safety risks to response teams both in the air and on the ground.
